## Knitting Pattern

### Materials Needed

#### YARN:

1 skein of worsted weight yarn from my good friends at **Four Arches Farms** ( approx. 200 yards).

**Note:** Any **worsted weight** yarn will do. I also tried out the pattern recently using a beautiful Malabrigo yarn in a bright red shade, and

#### NEEDLES:

##### Size 8 circulars

If you prefer, you can knit with DPNS as the beanie is knit in the round.

Days before our winter holiday trip to South Lake Tahoe in N. California, I went to visit my friend Pat at **Four Arches Farm** in Pembroke, Georgia—just a quick 45 minute drive outside of Savannah. I went to see her lovely new llama, and visit her friendly pack of alpacas my girls have grown so fond of. It was the first time I was able to check out her brand new alpaca blend yarns, and fell in love with this worsted weight tweed!

It is super soft and has just enough weight to give the beanie some body, and a nice drape without being thick or 'too hot' to wear—especially for my girls that have a lot of beautiful, thick hair!

I created the pattern on the airplane ride from Georgia to California, and my oldest wore it for the first time as we went to pick up some holiday gifts at Powderhouse, North Lake Tahoe.

Hence, the **Powderhouse Beanie!** (Photo on the left).

But I've since knitted several more both from Pat's beautiful yarn stash, and from my favorite go-to worsted weight Malabrigo Yarn (blue beanie you see below, on the right). I knit the blue Powderhouse Beanie for the same daughter, but this time for her freshman year in college. This is a great pattern to knit in school colors.

# Powderhouse Beanie

## Pattern

With US 8 size circular needles (or DPNs if you prefer), cast on 108 stitches (pattern is multiples of 12).

### Band

K1 P1 rib in the round until the band measures 2.5" from the cast on edge.

### Establish Powderhouse Beanie pattern:

\*K1, P11. Repeat from \* until end. Since you are knitting in the round, the pattern should continue seamlessly. Knit in this pattern for 5".

### Decrease Row 1

\*K1, P2Tog, P1, P2Tog, P1, P2Tog, P1, P2Tog  
Repeat from \* until end.

Next row:

\*K1, P7  
Repeat from \* until end.

### Decrease Row 2

\*K1, P1, P2Tog, P1, P2Tog, P1  
Repeat from \* until end.

Next row:

\*K1, P5  
Repeat from \* until end.

### Decrease Row 3

\*K1, P2Tog, P1, P2Tog  
Repeat from \* until end.

Next row:

\*K1, P3  
Repeat from \* until end.

### Decrease Row 4

\*K1, P3Tog  
Repeat from \* until end.

### Bind off
